

Exposure Trip To Longwa

The Department of Political Science organised a study trip to Longwa Village with the BA 6th semester students from 11th to 13th April 2025. The purpose of the visit was to study and learn the monarchical system of Angh (Anghship/kingship).

Longwa village is a unique and culturally rich village located in Mon district of Nagaland. The place is a truly fascinating that lies on the international border between India and Myanmar. The part of the village including the chief's house (Angh's Residence) is in both countries.

The main focus or aim of trip was to explore the culture of Longwa village, how is it governed and who is the final decision maker, and the most important part was to know and learn the Angh system of Konyak Naga tribe (Related to subject matter).

During the interview hour by the students, the Angh explained that his role and position has both symbolic and functional at the village level, that his word still carries immense weight in cultural matters/practices, conflict resolution and village unity.

The village reminded us that simplicity is not lack, but richness in its purest form. And that cultures like the Longwa village don't just survive, they resonate. So, overall travelling to Longwa village was not just a trip, but it was a great experience for the students as well as the teachers.

The study trip was executed under the guidance and supervision of Mr. Longchinti and Mr. Thangnyo Konyak, Assistant Professors from the department of Political Science.
