DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY SAO CHANG COLLEGE FIELD TRIP AT LANGA, KUTHUR VILLAGE.

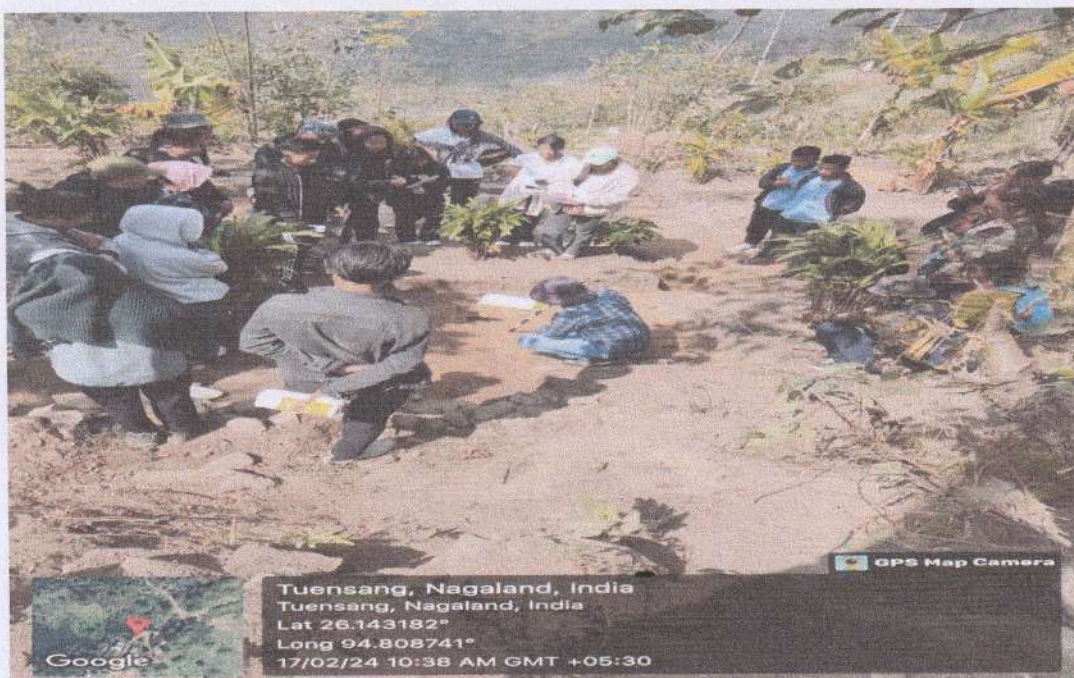
Department of History Sao Chang College organised a field trip to Langa village for the 6th semester honours students to visit the archaeological excavation site, on 17th of February, 2024. Langa is one of the ancient village of the yimkhiung tribe which is considered as old as 800 years. Many tribes trace their their origin from langa village. It lies to the south of Kuthur village, about 18 kilometres from Tuensang town. Professor Tiatoshi Jamir and his team of experts from Nagaland University and the University of Sydney and La Trobe University, Australia, gave a detailed lecture on the ongoing excavation being done at the site.

The main objective of this field trip was to let the student acquire firsthand knowledge about Archaeology by interacting with the team of experts and to understand the historical importance of Langa village.

Professor Tiatoshi Jamir demonstration the details of how excavation activities are processed. He also shed light on the variety of tools used on the process of excavation and demonstrated on how to record the findings by locating and identifying the number of the Grid correctly. It was a learning experience for the students. All the faculty from history department joined the field trip. The department appreciated Dr.Soyemla Akum Assistant professor from Department of English and Sir Akhato Sumi Assistant professor from department of Political science for their support and presence during the field trip.

Altogether, 38 members (6 faculties,30 students, A driver and a Handyman) attended the field trip.
